

A warm welcome to spring/summer in Perth Concert Hall and Perth Theatre. It's festival time in Perth, so it's a great chance to see some top names perform in the city, as well as discovering established and emerging talent from right on our doorstep.

Our friends at **Perth Festival of the Arts** have, once again, created a wonderfully eclectic programme bringing together international acts such as Jools Holland, English Touring Opera and Ruby Wax with some of our best home-grown performers, family shows, exhibitions and much more.

Perth Dance Festival gives local dance schools the chance to shine in *The Great Big Dance Show*. Sean Goldthorpe's *11 Million Reasons to Dance* is a series of emotive yet humorous photographs of people with sensory and mobility impairments who dance.

Perth Youth Theatre, Perth Youth Dance Company, Horsecross Glee and the Gordon Duncan Experience take centre stage in the Youth Arts Festival in June. We give 8 to 26-year olds the run of the place in the Perth Theatre Youth Take Over day.

Perth's **Southern Fried Festival** of American roots music spreads the country, soul, rock 'n' roll, blues and gospel love through the city over four days in late July. Headliners include Steve Earle, Rodney Crowell and Gretchen Peters.

Perth Theatre tours to rural venues across Perth and Kinross in May. Artistic Director Lu Kemp directs the Kieran Hurley scripted production of *A Six Inch Layer of Topsoil* and the *Fact it Rains* which playfully weaves conversations gathered from meetings in local communities with music and song.

Perth funny man Fred MacAulay is back 30 Years On from his standup debut. More comedy gold to look forward to includes Ed Byrne, Joe Lycett, Jason Manford and Sarah Millican.

And if all the above has inspired you to explore your creative side, Perth Theatre is offering acting and wardrobe summer courses for adults and 5 to 18 year-olds can create Disney musical *Alice in Wonderland Jr* in two weeks in our summer school.
